

WHAT TO EXPECT ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

- Designated Entrance & Homeroom Locations: Students will enter through their designated door, where they will find their name posted on the wall to help them locate their homeroom. Staff will be stationed in the hallways to assist and direct students to the correct classrooms. Please refer to the map on the page before to help your child pre-plan their route to their homeroom. Also, ensure your child knows they are welcome to come to the office for assistance anytime!
- First Day Orientation: Students will participate in orientation activities throughout the morning until the lunch break. A short nutrition break will take place mid-morning, so please remember to pack your child a snack. Orientation will include:

- Locks & Lockers: Locks and lockers will be assigned during orientation. Please do not send your child with a personal lock—each student will be provided with a school-issued lock, which is mandatory for the school year. Students are welcome to bring their school supplies gradually over the first few days to avoid carrying too much at once.
- Backpacks & Cell Phones: Backpacks must be stored in student lockers once assigned and are not to be carried throughout the day. Cell phones are not permitted in classrooms during instructional time and must be stored in student lockers. For full details, please refer to the ÉLJHS Student Personal Electronic Device Policy on Page 8.
- **School Fees:** Fees for school and quarter 1 option class fees will be added to student accounts during the first and second week of school. We kindly ask families to check their accounts regularly and submit payment as soon as possible once fees are posted.



ÉLJHS Personal Mobile Device Update



As we move through the school year at ÉLJHS, we want to remind families about the personal mobile device guidelines that have been in place since the beginning of the year. These guidelines continue to support a more focused and positive learning environment for all students.

What is considered a personal mobile device?

Personal mobile devices include any device that can be used to communicate or access the internet—such as a cell phone, tablet, gaming device, laptop, or smartwatch. This also includes accessories that connect to these devices, such as headphones, earbuds, and Bluetooth speakers.

What are the expectations at ÉLJHS?

These guidelines apply to all students, with exceptions for those using devices for health or medical reasons, to support specialized learning needs, or as part of a teacher-directed educational activity.

• Grade 7-9 Students:

Students are not permitted to use personal mobile devices during the school day. Devices brought to school must be turned off or set to silent and kept out of sight in backpacks, lockers, or designated areas. Ideally, devices should be left at home.

Social Media Access:

As part of the policy, access to known social media platforms is blocked for students on school networks and school-owned devices at all grade levels.

If a student uses a personal mobile device during class without teacher permission, staff will work with the student to ensure the <u>ÉLJHS Student Personal Electronic Device Policy</u> is clear and understood. We continue to rely on respectful communication and existing school processes to support student learning and accountability.

Why is this policy in place?

Schools that have implemented similar restrictions have already seen positive impacts on student well-being and achievement. At ÉLJHS, we're seeing students more engaged and less distracted, contributing to a more focused learning environment.





We would like to inform families that the ÉLJHS south parking lot is currently under construction and will be unavailable for use over the next few months. During this time, parents and visitors will need to park along the surrounding streets when dropping off or picking up students.

Please note that the bus loop is not available for parent parking or drop-off at any time.

For safety reasons, all students are expected to stay away from any construction zones on school property. We appreciate your cooperation in helping us keep our school community safe during this period of construction.

Black Gold School Division - TRANSPORTATION NEWS

As the 2025-2026 school year begins, the Transportation Department want to remind everyone that school buses will also be returning to the roads. All Black Gold School Division buses will begin transporting students to and from school starting Wednesday, August 27, 2025.

CAUTION: When the school bus *RED LIGHTS* are FLASHING, there is NO PASSING!

Flashing red lights and an extended stop sign (driver's side) means the school bus is stopped and students will be entering or exiting the bus. You must come to a complete stop around 4-5 car lengths (20 metres) away from the school bus. This distance allows other drivers to see the flashing lights and any students that may be crossing the roadway. Remain stopped until the red lights are no longer flashing and the stop sign on the driver's side is no longer extended.

All of our regular buses are equipped with cameras that capture license plate numbers. Any vehicle passing a school bus with flashing red lights and an activated stop sign will be reported to the RCMP, with video footage provided as needed.

The fine for passing a school bus when its red lights are flashing, if convicted, is \$567.00 along with 6 demerit points. We also have cameras in the inside the buses for the safety of riders and the drivers, and to deter and detect inappropriate activity.



We wish all students, their families, our drivers and the entire Black Gold community safe travels during the school year!

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE LLC:





*Please log into your PowerSchool Parent Portal to fill out the Textbook Policy Consent form ASAP

- All books will be barcoded and circulated through the École Leduc Junior High School library using the management software Destiny. Destiny has been implemented throughout Black Gold Regional Schools and tracks student textbook information with great accuracy.
- Textbooks are issued to students during the first couple of days of start-up and are due on the day of the final exam of the subject being written.
- Each student must fill out and return a Textbook Condition form, which is supplied to them when they receive their textbooks. The Textbook Condition form will allow students to identify damages within their textbook that they will not be held responsible for, which is then confirmed by the librarian.
- It is strongly suggested that students record the textbook barcode number somewhere safe. It is also suggested that the student write his/her name in the designated space on the inside cover of the textbook.
- At the end of the year, or when a student leaves the school, each textbook will be scanned as it is returned to the library. Students are expected to return the exact same textbook; returning someone else's is good for them, but not for you.
- The textbook tracking system will provide the obligation list that will be automatically emailed to the homeroom as well as
 to the parent/student home email if there are any outstanding books or fines. Please ensure the school office has your
 current email address.
- Fines will be issued for damaged textbooks per the severity. **Students should report textbook damage immediately.**Students who have misplaced their textbook may check in the library, lost and found or the office to see if it has been returned; otherwise, the student is responsible monetarily for the loss of the textbook. Another book will not be signed out until this requirement is met.
- Students are **NOT** allowed to share lockers. If a locker has been forcibly opened, report the damage and/or textbook theft to an administrator immediately! Students must report a locker theft as soon as it is noticed to the office.
- Students SHOULD NOT leave textbooks assigned to them in classrooms. Leave your books in the classroom AT YOUR
 OWN RISK! You are still responsible even if someone else damages or loses your book. Your teacher is NOT
 responsible for your book.
- Novel studies are considered textbooks and need to be returned to check out a new novel study.
- All fees for lost/damaged books will be added to the PowerSchool Parent Portal: Student's Fees & Forms
 account and made available to pay online using: Visa, Visa debit, Visa prepaid, Mastercard, Interac Online.
 Cheque or Cash can also be accepted in the office. from the previous school year will be sent to Collections
 by May 1.

May 28, 2025

2025-2026 Annual Budget

The Board of Trustees approved the 2025-2026 Budget Report for Black Gold School Division with revenues of \$169,151,378 and expenses of \$171,173,465 resulting in a \$2,022,087 deficit budget.

Annual Education Plan

The Board of Trustees accepted the 2025-2028 Black Gold School Division Education Plan as presented, for submission to Alberta Education, May 31, 2025.

Edwin Parr Award

The Black Gold School Division is proud to announce that Devon Reekie, a first-year Grade 8 science, physical education, and social studies teacher at Riverview Middle School in Devon, is a Zone 2 / 3 winner of this year's Edwin Parr Award. The annual Edwin Parr Teacher Award, named in honour of the first president of the Alberta School Trustees' Association (ASBA), recognizes outstanding first-year teachers for demonstrating excellence and innovation in teaching, leadership, and making significant contributions to their school communities.



Public School Boards' Association of Alberta (PSBAA) Membership

École Secondaire Beaumont Composite High School (ÉSBCHS) Excursion Approval in Principle
